

# COVID-19 Vaccines with CVS

Beginning February 11, 2021, CVS Health will offer COVID-19 vaccinations to eligible populations at a limited number of CVS Pharmacy locations in 11 states. CVS Health will receive approximately 250,000 doses from the federal government. As more supply becomes available, CVS Health will expand to additional states while increasing the number of stores offering vaccinations. Eligibility will be based on state guidelines, which are linked below.

For CVS Pharmacy locations that will begin to offer COVID-19 vaccinations on February 11, **appointments will become available for booking as early as February 9** as stores receive shipment.

Vaccines will be offered on an appointment-only basis via [CVS.com](https://www.cvs.com) or through the CVS Pharmacy app. People without online access can contact Customer Service at 1-800-746-7287.

CVS Health is also working directly with Indiana (utilizing two CVS Pharmacy locations) and Ohio (19 locations) to provide in-store vaccinations to eligible populations using state allocations. Other states may choose the same option, which is separate from the federal pharmacy partnership program but can run concurrently.
